<u>Positive Behaviour For Learning (PB4L)</u> - PB4L is a major piece of work that we are engaging with starting this year. Through this we will change our school positively to ensure school is a place that students and families feel really positive about:

PB4L School-Wide looks at behaviour and learning from a whole-of-school, as well as an individual child perspective. The framework is based on international evidence.

The Positive Behaviour for Learning School-Wide framework, otherwise known as PB4L School-Wide, is helping New Zealand schools build a culture where positive behaviour and learning is a way of life. The framework can be tailored to your school's own environment and cultural needs.

It's not about changing the students; it's about changing the environment, systems and practices you have in place to support them to make positive behaviour choices.

We have a team of 9 people, 2 of whom are from our community. The other members are made up of teachers, support staff and myself. We are feeling hugely positive that we are already on the right path at Plateau, and PB4L will really help us tie all our positive attributes together.

<u>Swimming Sports</u> - Despite the awful weather we are pushing ahead with our Swimming Sports tomorrow, although we may tweak things to ensure children are not sitting around in togs in a cold environment. As always, we welcome family members along to watch and cheer on the students.


For Sale - We have a number of USB chargers for sale for \$5.00 each. They will charge phones, iPads, etc. They are spare chargers from our Huawei cell


