We have had a great start to our year and we know 2018 is going to be a great year at Plateau. We have lots of events planned, including our anniversary celebrating Plateau School turning 50!!!

<u>Plateau Team Changes</u> - It gives me great pleasure to announce 4 additional members to the Plateau team. Firstly we welcome Elizabeth Morris who is our new Deputy Principal and also teaching in Paua Room. Elizabeth comes to us from Maidstone Intermediate. While Gary will be missed, Nikki Luke will be taking on the role of caretaker and has been working alongside Gary in the holidays to ensure continuity. Judith Burns will be our Librarian. Judith has a Master's degree in Librarianship and is looking forward to being part of the team and working with our students in the library. Moana Brown used to be a

student at Plateau and knows many of the staff who were here when she left. Moana has just finished her Psychology degree at Vic and will be joining us as a Teachers' Aide in our Junior area. Welcome all!

<u>Gary McIlwrick</u> - Gary, our amazing caretaker has left us for fulltime employment. He will be driving a digger for the Burns family business. Gary has done an incredible job and will be missed as he has been both a parent and employee at our school. We wish him well in his new role.

<u>Pedestrian Access</u> - Please ensure that you set a good example for students and when on foot ONLY access the school via the pedestrian walkway. Entering and exiting via the carpark is something we want to avoid as the children are strictly told not to walk down the driveway. We also ask that parents do not drop off or pick up, or park in the school car park between the hours of 8am - 4pm on school days. Thanks.

<u>Pou - Walking to School</u> - This year we are looking at not instituting a pou patrol. We found last year that often there was confusion or children did not arrive on time to take on the duty. I would appreciate feedback from parents who would ONLY drop students at the pou if there were Year 6 students on duty there, as we want to ensure we don't put people off while creating a manageable system.

<u>Flippaball, Hockey, ki o rahi</u> - There are 3 opportunities for our older students to get involved in sport outside of school this term. The Ki O Rahi tournament is on the 27th February and we have accessed some coaching for participants. There is big interest in our Year 5/6 students in Flippaball. 29 students have registered an interest in taking part so watch out for a Signmee for permission shortly for that and/or for Floorball.

<u>Makahika Camp</u> - Year 5/6 Camp - A Signmee was sent out on Monday for permission for camp. Please sign this as soon as possible.

We had 21 parents register their interest in attending, which is a fantastic response, however, unfortunately we can't take everyone. We selected parent helpers the fairest way we could by putting all names in a hat, and these were

the parents who were drawn out: Sarah Swan, Nichola Revell, Kelly Fairbrother, Charisa Lockley and Glen Falconer.

While we would love to take everyone who would like to attend that is just not possible. The camp is different to other camps in that it is all instructor led so there is not as much of a requirement for parents to attend.

The camp will be a great "warm-up" for our Year 5's as next year they will be going further afield and for longer. Camp is always a great way to get students working well together and to meet new challenges.

The cost of the camp has come down significantly with fundraising. We have raised over \$3300 towards the camp through grants and our cookie fundraiser. This has lowered the cost from \$350 to \$285. Invoices have been sent out and we would appreciate payment in full by 28th February (unless otherwise arranged with Sandra, ie account holders). Thanks.

In preparation for camp we will be walking up Plateau hill and along Plateau Road with the goal of walking to Tunnel Gully (by week 6). We will walk on Wednesday mornings at 9 a.m. You are welcome to come if you would like to walk with us. Please ensure your child has suitable shoes for walking, drink bottle, sun hat and rain jacket. If your child is unable to walk on any particular day, please can you let us know by phoning the office or by sending in a note.



Thank you for your support and encouragement for the students' reading.


